Dear Parishioners,

The news announced last weekend at all the Masses and the statement on both our parish website and that of the diocese in regards to Doug Johnson was very difficult and sad for everyone in the parish. At this time (of my writing), authorities have not updated the parish with any other official news.

I want to assure all of our families who currently entrust their children to our Faith Formation program that we follow the child and safety protection protocols that both the state and diocese require. We do our best to offer your children not only safe environments to embrace and learn about their faith but ones that are also life-giving.

If there is anyone in the parish and especially anyone who participated in our Youth Faith Formation program (formerly called Agape) who has any knowledge regarding misappropriate behavior or abuse during their time here, please get in touch with the police and the Arlington Diocese Office of Child Protection and Victim Assistance (703) 841-2530. I would also encourage you to reach out to one of the Oblate priests and/or the Director of Faith Formation, Mickie Abatemarco, and our current Youth Minister, Eric Muñoz if we can be of pastoral assistance.

This past weekend, we were fortunate to have counselors/ therapists from Catholic Charities available for the majority of the Masses. Though some individuals were able to embrace this opportunity, we recognize many were unable. Please know that Catholic Charities counselors are still available and encourage anyone who would find it helpful to contact them to set up a time to meet and help you process.

This Sunday's Readings: Genesis 2:18-24; Psalm 128:1-2, 3, 4-5, 6(5); Hebrews 2:9-11; Mark 10:2-16

In today's Gospel, Jesus reveals to us that God made marriage a holy committed relationship. St. Francis de Sales speaks similarly about marriage: Marriage is equally holy in the rich and in the poor. The preservation of holy marriage is of the highest importance for the state since it is the origin and source of all that flows from the state. If only our Savior were invited to every marriage, as He was to the marriage at Cana. The wine of his consolation and blessing would never be lacking.

Married people ought to have that mutual love that the Holy Spirit in Scriptures so highly recommends to them. The first effect of this divine love is an indissoluble union of the hearts, affections, and love of the husband and wife. The second effect of this divine love is the inviolable fidelity of husband and wife to each other. The third fruit of marriage is the birth and nurturing of children. Marriage is the nursery of Christianity. It is a great honor to you who are married that God empowers you to cooperate in so noble a work of creation in giving birth to children and properly nurturing them.

Husbands and wives advance more and more in the mutual love you owe to one another; take care that your love does not degenerate into jealousy of any kind. It often happens that just as a worm is bred in the ripest, most tender apple, so also jealousy grows in the most ardent and compelling love of husband and wife. Jealousy never gets in where friendship is based on true virtue in both persons. Love and fidelity joined together always produce intimacy and mutual trust. Why then do you not cherish each other with a completely holy, completely sacred, and completely divine love?






