## **St. John Neumann Catholic Church**

### ***Past, Present and Future***

As the number of families and Catholics in and around Reston increased dramatically in the late 1970s, Bishop Thomas J. Welsh recognized the need for a second Catholic parish in Reston.

On July 5, 1979, Bishop Welsh created our parish and named it after St. John Neumann, a member of the Redemptorist Order and the fourth bishop of Philadelphia (1852 to 1860). This saintly priest, who died while walking in heavy snow to visit a sick parishioner, was canonized just two years earlier on June 19, 1977.

St. John Neumann was founded to serve the people of South Reston and parts of Herndon, Vienna, and Fairfax, with the ministry of the Oblates of St. Francis de Sales.

For the first three years, while preparation and construction of the new Church was underway, weekend Masses were celebrated on Sunday mornings in the theater in the Hunters Woods Community Center and daily Mass was celebrated in parishioners' homes. The first rectory was located at 11901 Blue Spruce Road.

On June 28, 1982, our original 550-seat church (now the Chapel), was dedicated. Growth in the Reston area continued at an amazing rate, and soon attendance exceeded the 550-seat worship area. In 1996, it was decided that a new and larger worship space, classrooms, and offices were needed, and a groundbreaking ceremony was held on October 6, 2002. The new sanctuary was dedicated on May 23, 2004. The parish has now grown from the initial 800 families to over 2,500 families and continues to grow!

Since our inception, the Oblates have committed to staff the parish with its own priests, which means, as parishioners, we enjoy Salesian Spirituality threaded through all we do here at SJN.

In keeping with the spirit of Vatican II, major roles in the administration of St. John Neumann are shared with members of the laity. The Staff, Finance Committee, and the Pastoral Council advise the Pastor in major areas of policy and planning. All parishioners are encouraged to have a voice and be an active part of our present and future.

## The Oblates of St. Francis de Sales

The Oblates trace their roots to the dream of St. Francis de Sales.

It was a dream born of a conviction — that all people, of every social stratum, of every position, of every job, talent, or condition were called to holiness. St. Francis de Sales did it by his preaching, his teaching, and by his writings.

He wanted to found an order that would be dedicated to carrying on this work after his death, but he died without seeing this dream fulfilled. It was years later in 1873, that Fr. Louis Brisson founded the Oblates for the sole purpose of spreading the spirit and doctrine (“the dream”) of St. Francis de Sales.

Fr. Brisson sent the first Oblate to White Plains, New York, in 1893. From that time on, the Oblates gradually spread throughout North America while at the same time expanding throughout Europe, Africa, South America and India.

In the United States, they have worked in every apostolate where a need was manifested. They opened schools, staffed parishes, established retreat houses, and built summer camps. At the same time, the Oblates have witnessed their Christian faith by living and working in inner-city neighborhoods and serving as chaplains in hospitals, prisons, college campuses, and as military chaplains.

The Oblates first came to Virginia in 1956 when then Bishop Russell of Richmond asked them to staff Our Lady of Good Counsel parish in Vienna. In 1964, Bishop Ireton High School was opened and began operation under the direction of the Oblates. Then, four years after the Oblates took over St. John Neumann Parish, Bishop Welsh asked them to open and staff another high school, named Paul VI.

The Oblates’ presence in this diocese keeps alive the dream of St. Francis de Sales to call all people to holiness — through the gentleness of Salesian spirituality.

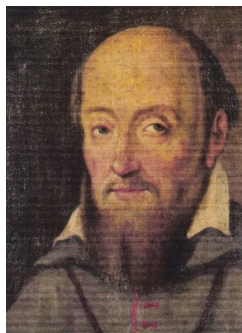
## **Salesian Spirituality**

### **V + J, *Vive Jesu* (Live Jesus)**

Welcome to Salesian Spirituality! *Vive Jesu*, or Live Jesus, is the Oblate motto. It was the guiding principle in the life of St. Francis DeSales and appeared on his own coat of arms. Salesian Spirituality is a way of living the Gospel as learned, lived, and shared by [St. Francis de Sales](#) (1567–1622) and St. Jane de Chantal (1572–1641).

Salesian Spirituality is characterized by what Francis called “the little virtues” such as gentleness, patience, and humility and the idea that all people are called to holiness.

This spirituality is a practical, intentional way of living a devout life by doing all through love and nothing through force. Salesian Spirituality teaches us to engage in heart-to-heart relationships with God and others. It encourages us to embrace fully the present moment and to not look forward to the future with anxiety but to place the future in God’s loving providence.

Jane met Francis in 1604.

They immediately established a bond of friendship that produced a Gospel-based spirituality that vibrantly endures to this day. Together, in 1610, they founded the Order of the Visitation, a religious order for women.

Francis and Jane’s humility and holiness serves as an example to guide us in strengthening our souls and growing in spirituality.

On the two pillars in our narthex are the portraits of St. Francis de Sales and St. Jane de Chantal reminding us of our own draw to Salesian Spirituality and the mission to “Live Jesus” in our daily life, allowing Jesus to live in us and through us. May Salesian Spirituality guide each of us at St. John Neumann to become a holy whole, person.

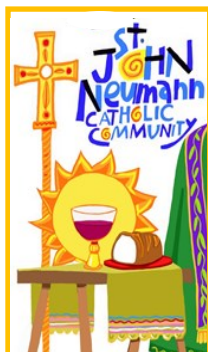

St. John Neumann Preschool provides a loving and nurturing environment in which Catholic values are taught and integrated into the daily life of our young students.

Our half-day preschool program, serving children ages 2-1/2 to 4 years old, is designed to prepare young children for their educational future. Early literacy and mathematics materials are used in all classrooms. Additionally, our unique location, backed by acres of woods, provides students with hands-on exploration of God's creation and novel ways to explore the wonders of STEM learning. Age-appropriate elements of religious education are incorporated into monthly themes, and all classes attend monthly chapel time.
